## RESOLUTION 24-XXX

### **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES REPEALING RESOLUTION 22-029, ADJUSTING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FOUR CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS, AND APPROVING A NEW OFFICIAL COUNCIL DISTRICT MAP FOR THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES BASED ON THE RESULTS OF THE 2020 DECENNIAL CENSUS**

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2019 the City Council adopted [Ordinance 1071 N.S.](#) pursuant to Government Code Section 2.65.040 adding Sections 2.65.030 and 2.65.040 to Chapter 2.65 of Title 2 of the City of El Paso de Robles Municipal Code establishing by-district elections for four council members, defining district boundaries, and scheduling the order of election for each district; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to [Elections Code Section 2.65.040 \(C\)](#) of the El Paso de Robles Municipal Code, the City Council is required to adjust the boundaries of any or all of the Council Districts following each decennial federal census. Using the census as a basis, the City Council must adjust the boundaries so that the Council Districts are as nearly equal in population as practicable and in compliance with all applicable provisions of law, including the United States and Federal Constitutions and the [Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 \(52 U.S.C. Section 10301 et seq.\)](#); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with California Elections Code Section 21607 and 21607.1, the City Council held public hearings on the drawing of district boundaries on: August 3, 2021 (1st Pre- Draft Public Hearing), October 5, 2021 (2nd Pre-Draft Public Hearing), March 1, 2022, (1st Post-Draft Public Hearing), April 5, 2022 (2nd Post-Draft Public Hearing). At each of the foregoing hearings, the public was invited to provide input on the composition of the new Council district boundaries. Additionally, the City sought the input of the public via the City's website and social media was also used to conduct outreach to residents. The proposed maps of the district boundaries were published on March 29, 2022 on the City's redistricting webpage at [www.prcity.com/770/City-Council-Districts](http://www.prcity.com/770/City-Council-Districts); and

WHEREAS, after closing the public hearing held on April 5, 2022, the City Council selected the map depicted in Exhibit "A" of this Resolution as the official Council District Map for the City of El Paso de Robles and approved by Resolution No. 22-029. Demographic data supporting the map based on the 2020 Census is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" of this Resolution and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the November 3, 2022 General Municipal Election, it was determined the Council District Map adopted by Resolution 22-029 included lands previously deannexed and returned to the County, which were no longer part of the corporate municipal boundaries of the City. The demographic consultant who prepared the Map approved by Resolution 22-029 revised said map to remove the non-municipal lands, and the revised map is depicted in Exhibit "C" of this Resolution as the official Council District Map for the City of El Paso de Robles and approved by this Resolution. Exhibit B remains unchanged.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. All of the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.
- Section 2. Resolution 22-029 is hereby repealed in its entirety.
- Section 3. Based on the information contained in agenda staff reports presented at public hearings held by City Council on the drawing of district boundaries on: [August 3, 2021](#) (1st Pre- Draft Public Hearing), [October 5, 2021](#) (2nd Pre-Draft Public Hearing), [March 1, 2022](#),

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(1st Post-Draft Public Hearing), April 5, 2022 (2nd Post-Draft Public Hearing), and February 6, 2024 (Consent Calendar), and the City Council evaluation of the available options and the input received from the public the City Council selected the map depicted in Exhibit “C” of this Resolution as the official Council District Map for the City of El Paso de Robles and approved this Resolution.

Section 4. Adoption of New Council District Map. The map attached hereto as Exhibit “C” to this Resolution, and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby approved and adopted as the Official Council District Map for the City of El Paso de Robles and shall be used in the 2024 general municipal election and all such elections for City Council thereafter, until further amended. The map shall be Exhibit A included in Ordinance 22-1118 amending section 2.65.040 to Chapter 2.65 of Title 2 of the City of El Paso de Robles Municipal Code adjusting the boundaries of the four city council districts and adopting a new official City Council District Map.

Section 5. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Resolution shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this Resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable.

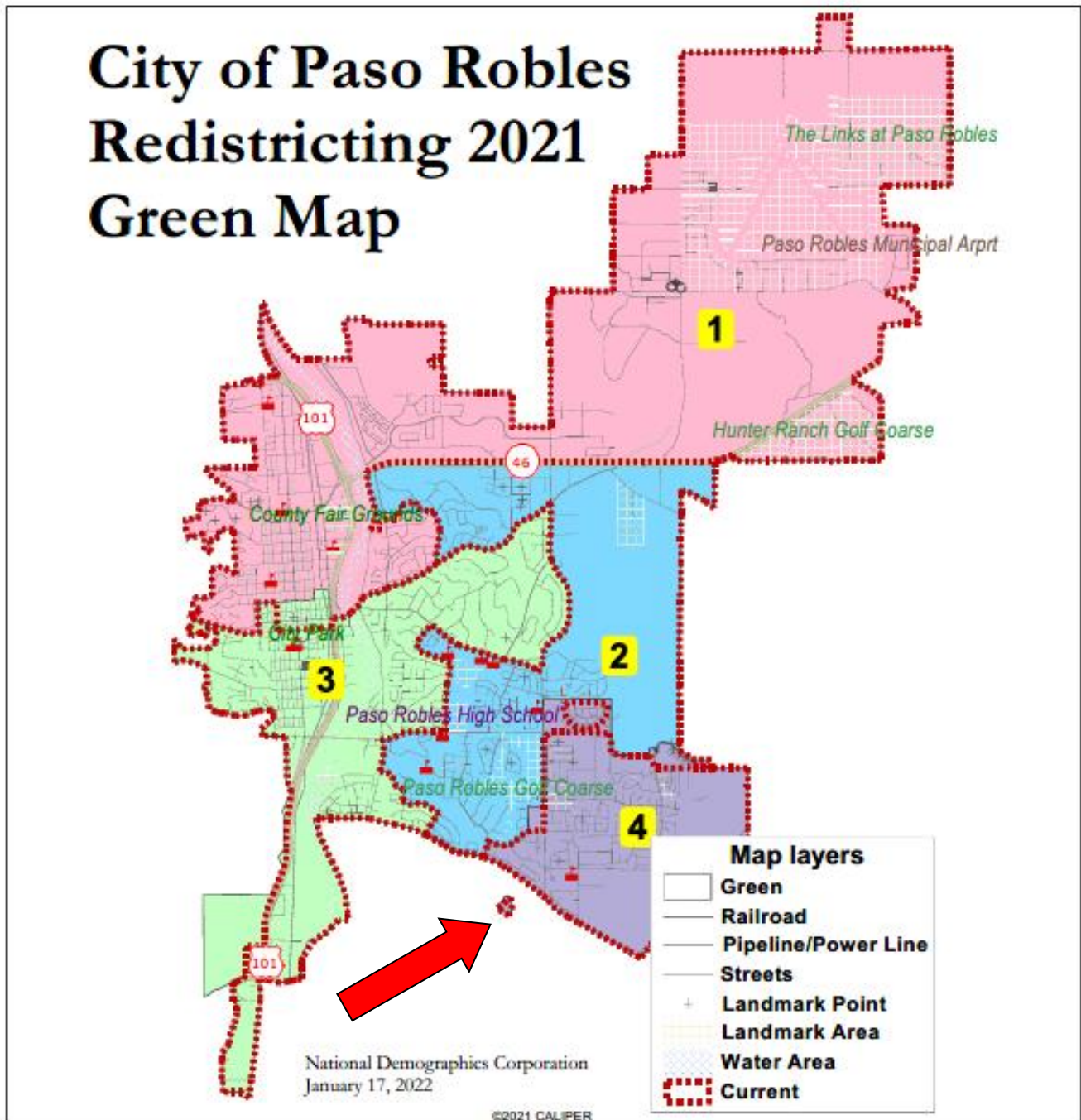
Exhibit A - Council District Map Adopted on 4/5/2022 (Green Map)

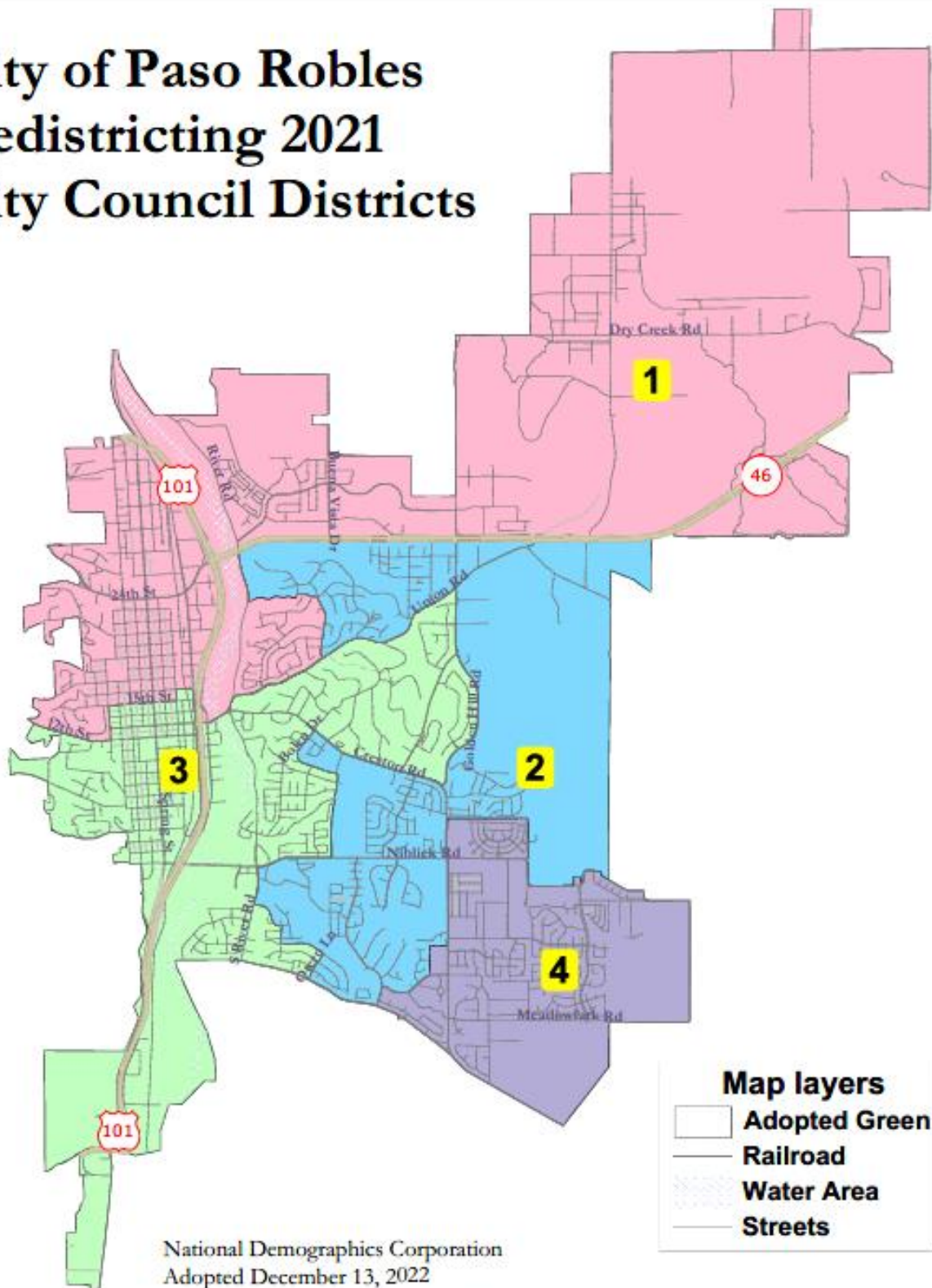
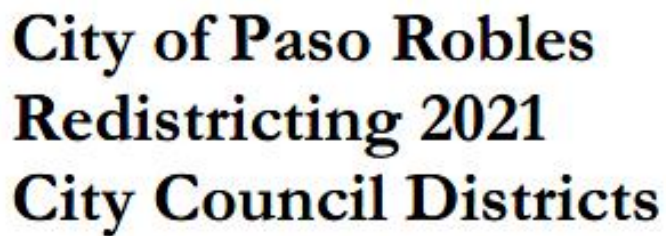
