Motioned by Councilmember Gregory, seconded by Councilmember Strong and passed 4-1 (Bausch opposed) to direct staff to bring back for introduction and first reading an ordinance increasing the Mayor and City Councilmember salary

to \$1,540 and \$1,155, respectively. **AYES:** Gregory, Strong, Roden, Hamon

Motioned by Councilmember Gregory, seconded by Mayor Hamon, and passed unanimously to approve Resolution 24-024, increasing the preauthorized travel and training limit for City Councilmembers to \$6,000 per year and to direct staff to return to Council with a list of the most commonly attended conferences and trainings to allow Council to pre-approve specific events.
