- 3. Translate frequently sought-after business startup materials into Spanish, ensuring equitable access to essential information for Hispanic business owners. Collaborate with City staff to identify materials in need of translation.
- 4. Develop comprehensive business support materials tailored specifically for the unique needs of the City of Paso Robles. Translate these resources into Spanish to ensure accessibility.
- 5. Undertake a minimum of 50 business visits annually, actively listening to challenges faced by entrepreneurs, and providing on-the-ground resources to foster growth and success.

- Craft a comprehensive certificate business training program that equips entrepreneurs with skills ranging from financial management to marketing strategies, empowering them to navigate the business landscape confidentially.

- 8. Work alongside City officials to ensure the collective concerns and aspirations of the Hispanic business community are effectively communicated and acted upon.
