RESOLUTION 23-XXX

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES AWARDING A CONTRACT FOR THE ANNUAL EAST SIDE STREETS SLURRY SEAL PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City uses Gas Tax funds to perform slurry seal maintenance of its street network to extend their useful life at minimum cost; and

WHEREAS, crack sealing has been completed on the following streets and they are now ready to receive a slurry seal treatment: Red River Drive, Shadow Meadow Way, Grassy Hollow Way, Blue Oak Way, Echo Court, Grand Canyon Drive, Crescent Oaks Way, and Oak Ridge Way; and

WHEREAS, to further extend the useful life of these streets, dig out repairs will also be performed at localized areas prior to receiving the slurry seal treatment; and

WHEREAS, staff prepared bid documents and advertised for bids. The engineer's estimate was \$495,000. At the bid opening on March 2, 2023, three bids were received ranging from \$499,186 to \$598,959.05, with Papich Construction providing the lowest responsible bid, in the amount of \$499,186.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All of the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

- Section 2. The City finds that this action is categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act "CEQA") under the Class 1 exemption, which applies to the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features where the project involves negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. (State CEQA Guidelines, § 15301.)
- Section 3. The City Council hereby awards the Annual East Side Streets Slurry Seal contract to Papich Construction for slurry seal treatment, and authorizes the City Manager to execute the Agreement, subject to any minor, technical, or non-substantive changes as approved by the City Manager and the City Attorney.
- Section 4. The City uses its Gas Tax Revenue to fund the Annual Slurry Seal program. There are adequate funds in the City's Gas Tax receipts to cover Papich Construction, in the amount of \$499,186, and no other action is required.
