## RESOLUTION 25-XXX

### RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES AWARDING A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR THE REPAIRS AND REHABILITATION OF THE WATER AND SEWER MAINS ON 17<sup>TH</sup> STREET, CAPITOL HILL AND ALMOND COURT AND A CHANGE ORDER FOR RELATED CONSTRUCTION SERVICES

WHEREAS, the FY 2024-25 adopted budget includes the road maintenance repairs of 17th Street from Riverside to 21st Street, Capitol Hill Loop, and Almond Court funded by Measure E-12 (now Measure I-24), supplemental sales tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, prior to repairing the road surface, the underground pipelines must be repaired and rehabilitated; and

WHEREAS, Plans, Specifications, and Estimates (PS&E) were prepared for the underground pipeline reconstruction and were advertised for bids; and

WHEREAS, at the bid opening on July 10, 2025, four (4) bids were received ranging from \$1,553,300 to \$2,187,940, with an engineer's estimate of \$1,615,000; and

WHEREAS, staff reviewed the lowest bid from Mainline Engineering and found it to be a responsive and responsible bid in the amount of \$1,553,300; and

WHEREAS, a change order to North Coast Engineering's contract, in the amount of \$242,242.55 is required to assist staff in construction review of submittals, pay estimates, provide compaction testing, and construction staking and surveying as well as the review of material certificates and provide answers and clarifications to questions during the construction phase.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All of the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Mainline Engineering to perform the repairs of the underground pipelines at Riverside, Capitol Hill, and Almond Court in the amount of \$1,553,300, and approve a change order to North Coast Engineering's contract in the amount of \$242,242.55.

Section 3. The City's Capital Improvement Budget for FY 2025-26 includes funding for these pipeline repairs, and no other action is required.

Section 4. The City finds that this action is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under the Class 1 exemption, which applies to the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features where the project involves negligible or no expansion of existing or former use (State CEQA Guidelines, § 15301).
